Now Active: MMRV Vaccine Reimbursement for Children Younger Than 4 Years of Age

April 24, 2026

Background

In September 2025, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)/Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) voted to remove the combined Measles, Mumps, Rubella, Varicella (MMRV) vaccine from the federal Vaccines For Children (VFC) program for children younger than 4 years of age. On December 12, 2025, the California Department of Public Health (CDPH) indicated it would continue recommending the combined MMRV vaccine for children younger than 4 years of age, and the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) signaled its intent to cover the vaccine for this population pursuant to authority under Assembly Bill 144. Under AB 144 (*Welfare and Institutions Code* [W&I Code], Section 14132.995), DHCS is authorized to cover vaccines recommended by the CDC/ACIP, American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP), American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG), or CDPH.

What Pharmacy Providers Need to Know

Pursuant to AB 144, Medi-Cal Rx will cover the combined MMRV vaccine for Medi-Cal members younger than 4 years of age, consistent with current CDPH recommendations and regardless of the federal CDC/ACIP recommendation, for claims submitted with a date of service (DOS) on or after December 12, 2025.

Claims submitted for a combined MMRV vaccine will be reimbursed following the standard Medi-Cal Rx vaccine payment method: **Ingredient Cost + Professional Dispensing Fee and Professional Service Administration Fee**. To receive the appropriate Professional Service Administration Fee, pharmacy providers should submit these claims with the appropriate amount in the Submitted Incentive Fee field and with the following Drug Use Review (DUR) codes:

- Reason for Service Code: PH – Preventative Health Care
- Professional Service Code: MA – Medication Administration
- Result of Service Code: 3N – Medication Administered

Claims will be reimbursed at the lesser of the Submitted Incentive Fee or the Allowed Incentive Fee.

The combined MMRV vaccine will follow the established process for Medi-Cal members 4 years of age and older. For children in this population, the vaccine will continue to only be covered under the federal VFC program at the standard Medi-Cal Rx VFC rate.

What Pharmacy Providers Need to Do

Effective today, pharmacy providers can submit claims for the combined MMRV vaccine for Medi-Cal members younger than 4 years of age with a DOS on or after December 12, 2025. These claims should be rebilled within six months of the original DOS to avoid any timely filling cutbacks.
